

The York County Board of Commissioners met according to law on September 16, 2010 at 9:57 a.m. as per notice in the York News Times on September 11, 2010, with Vice Chairman Steve Neujahr, with Commissioners Kurt Bulgrin, Patricia Bredenkamp and Eugene Bergen. Also present were Melanie Wilkinson, reporter for the York News Times; Bill Bamesberger, Tom Shellington and County Assessor, Ann Charlton. Commissioner Augustus M. Brown Jr. was absent.

The agenda of the meeting was posted on the bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and a copy of the agenda was made available to each Commissioner.

Neujahr announced that the Open Meetings Law was posted outside the door along with copies in the back of the Board Room. Proof of publication was also available.

Moved by Bredenkamp, seconded by Bergen to adopt the agenda for September 16, 2010 as presented; roll call: yeas, Bredenkamp, Bergen, Bulgrin and Neujahr; nays, none; Brown absent; motion carried.

The Public Hearing to adopt the 2010-2011 budget was continued from September 7, 2010. The Chairman asked if any one would like to speak. No one responded. The Chairman closed the public hearing at 10:00 a.m.

Moved by Bredenkamp, seconded by Bergen to adopt Resolution #10-54 adopting the budget as presented; roll call: yeas, Bredenkamp, Bergen, Bulgrin and Neujahr; nays, none; Brown absent; motion carried.

Under discussion, Commissioner Bulgrin stated that everyone came in good at or below their last year's budget. He commented that the Board needs to determine in the future what the responsibility of the County is and make some priorities. The Sinking Fund was created to pay for the re-appraisal of the county's commercial property. Initially, \$50,000 had been budgeted for that, however through this process; we cut about \$25,000 off of that. What is budgeted out of the Inheritance Fund for other governmental subdivisions and non-profits, is it really our responsibility to be funding those things where we had to cut \$25,000 from the Sinking Fund that's going to generate more valuation for the county, I think that that's our responsibility. We need to start looking ahead and start funding those things that we need to fund to ease the tax burden on our agricultural sector and home owners and maybe we need to give less money to some of those subdivisions that need to start taking care of their own business.
